CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The West Virginia State Office administers CSBG funds to **16 Community Action Agencies** in **100%** of WV counties

In West Virginia, Community Action Agencies provided services to **105,816 low-income individuals.**

68% of families served by the CSBG Network lived below **100%** of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

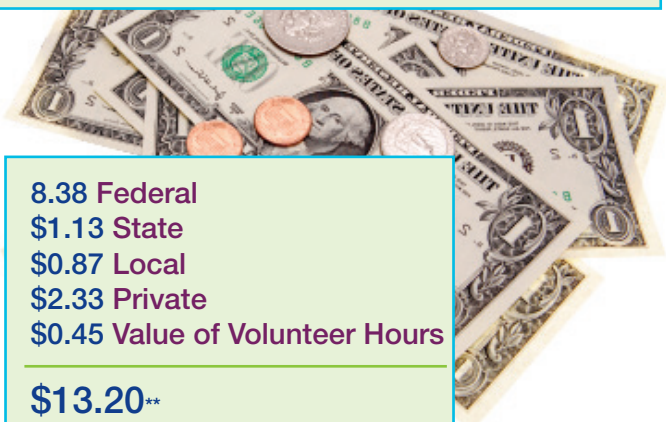
37% of families served in WV were in **severe poverty**, below **50%** of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Nationally, **over 1,000 Community Action Agencies** receiving CSBG funding provided services to **15.9 million individuals with low-incomes.**

Nationally, of the **6.9 million families** served by the CSBG Network, **71.43%** were living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the WV Network leveraged **\$13.20** from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours*



\$7,036,689 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of local entities in West Virginia.

The WV Network's non-CSBG funding totaled **\$92,880,483.**

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CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR WEST VIRGINIA

Services and strategies provided by the WV Network resulted in **187,310 outcomes** for participants and communities with low incomes.

Outcomes Include:

Employment

Participants with low incomes in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.

5,706

Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization

Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.

27,138

Child and Family Development

Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

2,365

Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes

Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.

5,315

Family Stability

Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.

15,801

Emergency Assistance

Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.

72,670

Community Opportunities and Resources

Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.

5,785

Community Empowerment

Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
