CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The Dist. of Columbia State Office administers CSBG funds to 1 Community Action Agency in 100% of DC counties

92% of families served by the CSBG Network lived below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

82% of families served in DC were in severe poverty, below 50% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

In the District of Columbia, the Community Action Agency provided services to 79,001 low-income individuals.

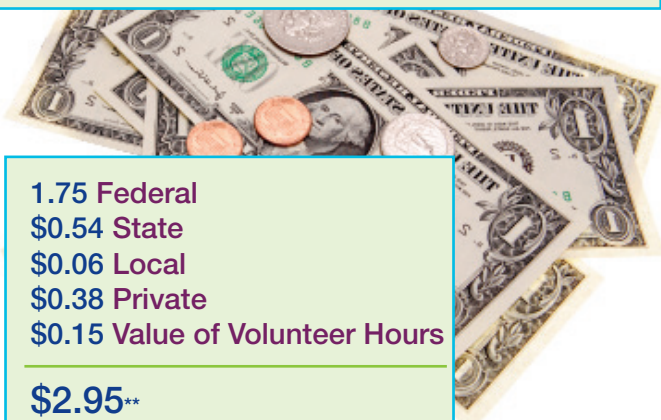

Nationally, of the 6.9 million families served by the CSBG Network, 71.43% were living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, over 1,000 Community Action Agencies receiving CSBG funding provided services to 15.9 million individuals with low-incomes.

CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the DC Network leveraged \$2.95 from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours*



\$10,782,695 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of the local entity in the District of Columbia.

The DC Network's non-CSBG funding totaled \$31,756,134.

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CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR DIST. OF COLUMBIA

Services and strategies provided by the DC Network resulted in **53,812 outcomes for participants and communities with low incomes.**

Outcomes Include:

13,710

Employment

Participants with low incomes in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.

Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization

Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.

Child and Family Development

Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes

Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.

Emergency Assistance

Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.

Community Opportunities and Resources

Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.

Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
