## West Virginia

### CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The West Virginia State Office administered CSBG funds to **16 Community Action Agencies**.

In West Virginia, Community Action Agencies provided services to **111,623 low income individuals**.

**66%** of families served by the CSBG Network lived below **100%** of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

**35%** of families served in WV were in severe poverty, below **50%** of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

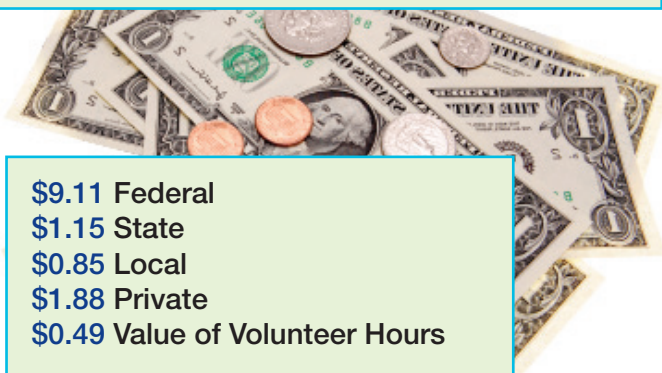

Nationally, of the **4.2 million families** served by the CSBG Network who reported income, **87%** were living at or below **125%** of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, **1,005 Community Action Agencies** receiving CSBG funding provided services to **15.7 million individuals with low incomes**.

### CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every **\$1** of CSBG, the WV Network leveraged **\$13.47** from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours.\*

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## CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR WEST VIRGINIA

Services and strategies provided by the WV Network resulted in **202,639 outcomes** for participants and communities with low incomes.

### Outcomes Include:

<b>105,132</b>	<b>Employment</b> Participants with low incomes in the CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.
<b>4,038</b>	<b>Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization</b> Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.
<b>30,705</b>	<b>Child and Family Development</b> Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.
<b>3,866</b>	<b>Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes</b> Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.
<b>13,623</b>	<b>Family Stability</b> Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.
<b>15,469</b>	<b>Emergency Assistance</b> Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.
<b>23,872</b>	<b>Community Opportunities and Resources</b> Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.
<b>5,934</b>	<b>Community Empowerment</b> Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
