

# The NeWAP/LIHEAP Partnership

#### History

- The NeWAP and LIHEAP Programs have partnered together since 1982 to provide elderly and low-income clients with energy efficiency improvements
- In 2017 the two programs started to meet on a monthly basis to better provide client services and to provide a coordinated focus on the energy efficiency needs of our mutual clients
- This approach has led to program improvements associated with augmented funds and sub-grantee administrative costs
- During the last quarter of 2018, in partnership, the NeWAP Heating/Cooling Repair and/or Replacement Assistance Program (HCRRA) was developed



NeDHHS Furnace or Central Air Conditioner Repair or Replacement Assistance Program

- NeDHHS may pay up to \$750 to repair or replace a furnace or a central air conditioning unit.
- For Heating and Cooling Replacement Assistance
  - Clients must be at or below 130% poverty
- Before NeDHHS can authorize payment, the client must:
  - must pay or arrange to pay the repair or replacement cost that exceeds the Department's portion and
  - provide NeDHHS with receipts or a payment agreement.
  - If extenuating circumstances exist, NeDHHS may authorize repair or replacement assistance for more than \$750.





NeDHHS Furnace or Central Air Conditioner Repair or Replacement Assistance Program

- Additionally, for Cooling Replacement Assistance a qualifying household must include a household member:
  - is a child under age 6 and receives ADC
  - is age 70 or older, or
  - has a severe illness or condition which is aggravated by extreme heat as verified by a medical statement signed by a licensed healthcare provider
- Provisions are made thru the program for the purchase of window air conditioners
- NeDHHS completed 84 units in the year prior to implementation of this NeWAP/LIHEAP HCRRA program.



The Benefits of Implementation of the NeWAP/LIHEAP HCRRA with *a portion* of the NeWAP Heating/Cooling Repair and/or Replacement Assistance Program include:

- Establishing a \$5,000 per home cap
- Uses the 200% poverty eligibility level established in the Weatherization Program
- Owner occupied units "only"
- Every installation receives a subgrantee QCI and CAZ
- 10% of all installations are monitored by state QCIs
- If "post-implementation" Health & Safety issues are discovered (i.e. back-drafting, orphaned water heater venting) LIHEAP augmented funds can be used to remedy the issue
- An additional \$500,000 in funding + administration costs was made available and dispersed per formula grant to subgrantees

- Client verifies emergency with redtag, written documentation or subgrantee evaluation. Subgrantee:
  - Verifies that it is a previously weatherized client
  - Secures previous client files (if available) or starts new client files
  - Calls for HVAC bids, requiring appropriate sizing, efficiencies and warranties as per NeWAP requirements
  - Awards successful bid and installation is completed
  - Completes final QC inspection

- Client verifies emergency with redtag, written documentation or subgrantee evaluation
  - Subgrantee verifies that it is not a previously weatherized client
  - If the client is not interested in weatherization -
  - If the client is interested in weatherization
    - Complete NeWAP application and eligibility review
    - Calls for HVAC bids, requiring appropriate sizing, efficiencies and warranties as per NeWAP requirements, award successful bid, complete emergency installation and QCI
  - Proceed with standard weatherization process and prioritize for weatherization work

- Unused funds were to be evaluated by the program partners prior to the last quarter of the program year for possible conversion
- The program officially started on January 1, 2019
- BUT IT WASN'T A TYPICAL YEAR IN NEBRASKA!










- Historic Flooding in March of 2019!
  - 1–3 inches of rainfall, bombogenesis, an epic drop in air pressure that triggers historic weather, on top of late winter snow (30 inches of snow) and moisture saturated soil
  - Rivers and creeks throughout the eastern third of the state flooded
  - Eligible clients in flooded homes lost heating and cooling equipment that is still being replaced with HCRRA funding
  - Many homes in the southeast corner of the state still have standing water and flooded mechanical equipment in the basements



- May 2019 Central Nebraska Floods
  - 9 inches of rainfall and already swollen rivers
  - Flooding not only from the rainfall but also from overwhelmed sewer systems and saturated soil
- To-Date Our Subgrantees Have Completed Work on HCRRA 53 Homes
  - Although flooding work isn't specifically tracked thru our database, subgrantees have reported 25 of the 53 completed homes were flood victims and work is inprogress on and additional 23 flood homes
  - The remaining funds are obligated for work in HCRRA homes not impacted by flooding
