From the National Low-Income Housing Coalition (NLIHC)....

We're already seeing evictions surge across the nation:

- AZ: <u>52 eviction cases in Tucson, Arizona are being processed per day</u>, compared to 10 to 30 cases normally.
- CA: <u>Thousands of California families</u> are doubling up. And if they aren't able to stay where they are, they're going to be forced out onto the streets.
- CO: 400,000 Coloradans are at risk of evictions.
- GA: 2,000 eviction cases are pending in Fulton County alone.
- IL: Requests for eviction assistance have <u>doubled in Chicago</u>, compared to last year.
- KY: 340,000 people in Kentucky are at risk of evictions.
- OH: <u>Franklin County</u>, <u>Ohio</u> is processing 100 eviction cases a day. In Columbus, Ohio, eviction hearings are taking place in a <u>convention center</u> in order to accommodate the number of cases and adhere to social distancing guidelines.
- MI: State officials estimate <u>75,000 eviction cases will be filed</u>.
- NC: A 9,000-case backlog of evictions resumed on June 21.
- NY: New York City expects 50,000 to 60,000 eviction cases.
- NV: Experts in Nevada expect a flood of evictions when the moratorium is lifted.
- SC: <u>South Carolina already the #1 state for evictions</u> is bracing for a surge in eviction cases.
- TN: More than 9,000 eviction cases in Tennessee are pending in one county alone.
- TX: More than <u>2,000 eviction cases in Harris County</u>, <u>Texas</u> are moving forward as the moratoriums are lifted.
- VA: Given historically high levels of evictions, experts are predicting <u>tens of thousands of Virginia families</u> will face eviction without emergency rental assistance.
- WI: Eviction filings are up 40% in Wisconsin compared to last year.
