RELATED REFERENCES:

Community Services Block Grant Act, 42 U.S.C. 9901 et seq.; Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, 2020, Public Law 116-36; and Department of Health and Human Services Block Grant Regulations, 45 CFR Part 96.

PURPOSE:

To inform states and U.S. territories of the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) application requirements for Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) funds. States and territories must submit their CARES Act state plan applications to the Office of Community Service (OCS) by September 1, 2020 using the approved CSBG CARES Act Supplemental State Plan format.

BACKGROUND:

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, 2020, Public Law 116-36, was signed into law on March 27, 2020, providing \$1 billion in additional funds to the CSBG program. The funds to states and territories authorized under the CSBG Act are intended to address the consequences of increasing unemployment and economic disruption as a result of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

In an effort to provide an immediate response to the needs of the states and territories, OCS awarded the supplemental CARES Act funds on May 8, 2020. All states and territories that

CSBG CARES Act Supplemental State Plan

Due in OLDC by September 1, 2020

 No public hearing required; must post plan publicly for an OCS recommended period of 10 business days at a minimum

Content is similar to the regular CSBG State Plan; will require states to provide:

- SF-424M
- CSBG CARES Act Supplemental State Plan, sections 1-5, 7-10, 12, 14, & 15

Legislative Update-COVID Relief

Reminder: HEROES Act passed House back in May

- 1800 pages, \$3 Trillion in aid
- No new CSBG funding, but clarified small state allocation, 200% eligibility, and timely release of funds
- \$1.5 Billion supplemental to LIHEAP, \$1.5 Billion water assistance program
- Increased funding for nutrition programs, TANF Flexibility
- Aid for state and local governments
- Additional \$1,200 payments to individuals

Senate to (finally) introduce its counterpart to HEROES the Week of July 20th



Legislative Update

Appropriations

- House released FY 2021 Labor HHS Appropriations Bill week of 7-6-20
 - CSBG recommended to receive \$10 million increase to \$750 million
 - Expanded eligibility to 200% of poverty
 - \$25 million increase to LIHEAP
 - Senate is further behind on appropriations, Continuing Resolution likely unavoidable

Reauthorization

No movement

Additional Bills

- H.R. 7328, "The Community Services Block Grant Enhancement Act"
- 200% of poverty, small state allocations, timely distributions
