- The only national, peer review based, recognition of community action managers and leaders.
- Developed by Community Action leaders in 1991 with advisement from a certification industry expert.
- Oversight by the Certification Commission appointed by the Partnership Board Chair.





#### **CCAP Across America**

An analysis of CCAP completed earlier this year, before the 2020 class was certified revealed:

- 746 Active CCAPs + 63 in 2020 Class (still working in the Network).
- 746 Active CCAPs spread across 230 CAAs (out of 1,000), 17 State Associations, 3 CSBG State
   Offices, 3 National Partners.
- In 24 States we have fewer than 10 CCAPs.
- In 8 States we have no CCAPs.





## Who is Eligible for CCAP Candidacy?

- Individuals who have held a leadership role for at least 2 years.
- Individuals employed by a qualifying organization: a CAA, delegate agency or subgrantee of a CAA, a CSBG eligible entity, a state or regional CAA association office, or a state CSBG office member.





## **CCAP Body of Knowledge**

CCAP is Based on two "pillars"

FIRST PILLAR is...

The Community Action Body of Knowledge

A five-section list of the knowledge and skills which community action managers and leaders need in order to function in a position of leadership in their community and agency.

- 4. Leadership in Community Action

## Code of Ethics: Standards of Conduct for Professionals

#### **SECOND PILLAR** is...

The Community Action Code of Ethics:

A standard for professional behavior that guides the decisions a community action leader makes. All candidates sign an agreement to abide by the Code of Ethics.

- Complete the Candidate Data Form (1/20/2021)
- Complete the Executive Skills Portfolio (1/17/2021)
- Pass the Written Exam (Mid-June 2021)


