

## Our Work Impacted by COVID 19



As of the end of August we have provided 446,630 meals and 1,900 food boxes to families through many different collaborations including: CACFP, Good Shepard Food Bank, Private Donations, and SFSP



By the end of August we have processed thousands of rent relief applications and facilitated payments through Maine Housing totaling more than \$4.2 million to area landlords. These payments were made on behalf of more than 4,400 families.



In collaboration with MaineHousing and the University of Maine at Presque Isle, Maine opened two temporary shelters which resulted in assisting over 150 homeless people by providing safe shelter, personal care products, food, and access to community resources. We made over 273 referrals and linked 2,906 services to area organizations for the shelter guests.

Since April, with funds from the Maine Community Foundation and beyond, we have been able to supply household goods, hygiene products, diapers, wipes, and formula to 3,085 families.

As of the end of August, we have enrolled 1700 families in our Whole Family programs across the state – connecting them with needed resources to assist them in achieving stability.

Maine's network has been able to provide varying types of financial assistance which includes childcare payments, emergency fuel, telephone bill payments, food and gasoline prepaid cards, car loan and insurance payments, and utilities payments.
