Legislative Update

Appropriations

- Funding CR expires 12/11
- House approved FY 2021 Labor HHS Appropriations in omnibus funding bill 7/31
 - CSBG to receive \$10 million increase to \$750 million
 - Expanded eligibility to 200% of poverty
 - \$25 million increase to LIHEAP
- Senate has released but not passed FY2021 Appropriations
 - CSBG funding flat at \$740 million
 - No increase in eligibility
 - No increase for LIHEAP

No movement



Legislative Update-COVID Relief

Speaker Pelosi & Treasury Secretary Mnuchin continue bill negotiations

- Senate says bill could be passed "early next year"
- Bill contains ~\$2 Trillion, including state and local aid
- No CSBG changes, \$1.5 Billion supplemental to LIHEAP
- Additional \$1,200 payments to individuals

Reminder: HEROES Act passed House back in May

- This could serve as foundation of a relief bill under a Biden Presidency
- \$3 Trillion in aid
- No new CSBG funding, but clarified small state allocation, 200% eligibility, and timely release of funds
- \$1.5 Billion supplemental to LIHEAP, \$1.5 Billion water assistance program
- Aid for state and local governments
- Additional \$1,200 payments to individuals









FY18 Data – Brief Highlights

FY 2018 Top 5 Outcomes



- The number of individuals with disabilities who maintained an independent living situation.
- The number of seniors (65+) who maintained an independent living situation
- The number of households with improved energy efficiency and/or energy burden reduction in their homes.
- The number of individuals who demonstrated improved physical health and well-being.
- The number of individuals who achieved one or more outcomes

CSBG Annual Report Update

- FY19 data review for Modules 1, 2, and 4 has been completed.
- States have not received information on Module 3.
- States are submitting updated FY19 Module 2 and 4 data where necessary.
- We anticipate FY19 data being finalized by early December.
- We anticipate the release of FY20 SmartForms to be sometime in January.



CSBG Annual Report Update

- CSBG Annual Report (FY20)
 - OCS stated that there will be a deadline extension to April 30, 2021
 - No expected changes to the forms or the XMLs
 - Will contain Modules 1-4

CSBG Annual Report Update

- CSBG CARES Supplemental Annual Report (Proposed).
 - OCS stated that this will be due May 30, 2021 (this is a Sunday).
 - Will be 'separate' from the regular CSBG Report.
 - We can expect a 'simplified' Module 1, 2 and 4.
 - No mention of Module 3.
- CSBG **Disaster** Supplemental Annual Report (Proposed)
 - Same information as above for CARES

CSBG Performance Management Website

- NASCSP is supporting OCS in the development of the CSBG Performance Management Website that will highlight state level CSBG data.
- States will be able to pull reports with graphs and charts and query the system for information found in state plans and Module 1.
- The website will be released only to states first prior to the general public.
- There will eventually be a public and private side.
