



Legislative Requirement for Monitoring

- OCS conducts standard monitoring reviews as required under Section 678B(c) of the CSBG Act:
 - "...shall conduct in several states in each fiscal year evaluations (including investigations) of the use of funds received by the states under this subtitle in order to evaluate compliance".
- Monitoring reviews follow a standard monitoring protocol addressing administrative, programmatic, and fiscal compliance with CSBG Act requirements.

CSBG state lead agencies describe and provide documentation demonstrating the agency's approach to oversight and monitoring to support compliance with legislation.

OCS explores and understands how CSBG state lead agencies effectively manage and oversee all areas.

CSBG state lead agencies intentionally focuses on the administration to meet the goals of CSBG within their state, carry out the provisions of the CSBG Act, and describe the design and structure of CSBG within their state.

OCS explores and understands how the CSBG state lead agencies use data from their state network to inform the administration based on the needs of their state.

CSBG state lead agencies describe how the administration of CSBG provides effective oversight, adapts to changing needs (e.g., natural shifts in the community, natural disasters, public health crises), and show understanding of the type of data collected to oversee the provision of quality services for individuals, families, and communities with low-income.


