




The CSBG State Plan

- Required by Section 676(b) of the CSBG Act
- Covers one or two federal fiscal years (state's choice)
- Shows how state CSBG funding is allocated
- Sets goals for agency satisfaction and network achievements
- Outlines Training and Technical Assistance activities of the network
- Establishes monitoring schedule and procedures
- Sets the stage for the CSBG Annual Report


Promising Practices

- 3. Gather Input First: Prior to Drafting the State Plan
- 4. Close the Loop: Follow-up on All Comments
- 5. Modified Public Hearing
- 6. Complete a Two-Year State Plan





<u>Nebraska</u>

State Plan Process: 2-year Plan

December: Schedule a meeting for January to meet with the CAAs and State Association virtually to discuss the current State Plan and any changes for the coming State Plan

January: Meet with the CAAs and the State Association

February-March: State CSBG Office creates the new State Plan and checks in with the CAAs and the State Association on any feedback to the new drafted State Plan

April: Receive administrative approvals

May: Schedule a public hearing for June and send out media invites for the hearing

June or July: Hold a public hearing

July-August: Respond to any public comments received and make revisions to the State

Plan

By September 1st: Submit State Plan once finalized



State Plan Process: 2-year Plan

February: Hold our Legislative Hearing the year the Plan is due

February-March: Schedule a webinar – Share our existing State Plan and walk through a blank Plan to highlight each section and what is being asked

April: Begin a round of small regional listening sessions (pre-pandemic was in person) with the Directors of each CAA to hear any concerns and walk through content of each section

May/June: Share draft with CAA Directors for feedback

June: Schedule and post announcement for public hearing in July

July: Hold a public hearing

July-August: Respond to any public comments received and make any final revisions to the

State Plan

By September 1st: Submit State Plan
