## For FFY 2020:

There were 7 CAAs, serving 16,810 people with low incomes who were living in 7,719 families.

CAAs served 2,467 people who lacked healthcare, 2,640 people who reported having a disability, 1,947 senior citizens, 6,448 children living in poverty, and 552 veterans and active military persons.





# WHAT IS CSBG?

The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) provides critical funding to Community Action Agencies (CAAs) to operate programs addressing the causes and conditions of poverty under three national goals:

North Dakota's Community Action Agencies are centrally located to serve their communities. For maximum impact, they partnered with:

- 307 non-profits
- 478 for-profits

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- 155 faith-based organizations

For every \$1 of CSBG, North Dakota's CAAs leveraged \$6.87 from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours.



- \$3,971,235 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of CAAs in North Dakota in FY20.
- Including all leveraged funds North Dakota had \$30,945,989 available to the CAA network to improve the lives of people with low incomes in FY20.

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Community Action Agencies utilize CSBG funds to address specific local needs through services and programs that address one or more of the core domains in which we work: employment, education and cognitive development, income, infrastructure and asset building, housing, health and social behavioral development, and civic engagement and community involvement.

## **EMPLOYMENT**

36 outcomes were obtained in the employment domain. This includes outcomes such as obtaining and maintaining a job, increasing income, and obtaining benefits.

#### **EDUCATION**

3,020 outcomes were obtained in the education and cognitive development domain. This includes outcomes such as improved literacy skills, school readiness, and obtaining additional education and diplomas.

### **INCOME & ASSETS**

282 outcomes were obtained in the income and asset building domain. This includes outcomes such as maintaining a budget, opening a savings account, increasing assets and net worth, and improving financial well-being.



### **CIVIC ENGAGEMENT**

13 outcomes were obtained in the civic engagement and community involvement domain. This includes outcomes such as increasing leadership skills, and improving social networks.

#### HOUSING

7,129 outcomes were obtained in the housing domain. This includes outcomes such as obtaining and maintaining housing, avoiding eviction or foreclosure, and reducing energy burden.

## HEALTH

8,628 outcomes were obtained in the health and social/behavioral development domain. This includes outcomes such as increasing nutrition skills, improving physical or mental health, and living independently.

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
