Executive Director's Report




Board Updates

BIL Landing Page



The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), also known as the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was passed in late 2021. The BIL made a number of historic investments including \$3.5 billion in the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP). The Department of Energy (DOE) oversees BIL funds as well as "regular" formula funds. Initial rounds of BIL funds were disbursed through 5 year grants in 2022 and 2023. BIL funds also support innovation grants including Enhancement and Innovation (E&I) and Sustainable Energy Resources for Consumers (SERC) grants totaling up to \$25 million and \$70 million, respectively.







The NASCSP Weatherization Assistance Program Annual Funding Survey reaches all WAP grantees to track funds in the weatherization network, the source of those funds, funding trends, resulting production, and the funding future over each Program Year. NASCSP partners with NCAP in a coordinated data collection effort to capture funds that go directly to WAP subgrantees, resulting in a comprehensive annual funding report. 




PY 2022 Annual Funding Report

PY 2022 Annual Funding Report




- Production data by funding source by state is available



- On Aug. 16, 2022, President Biden signed the landmark Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), which authorized \$8.8 billion for States to run the Home Efficiency Rebate and Home Electrification and Appliance Rebate programs.
- DOE has funded NREL to provide Technical Assistance to States as they
 design and stand-up their rebate programs. NREL can help your State
 Energy Office coordinate the rebate program with WAP.







distributions for 100 parameters structured in a dependency tree



WAP MEMO 121 & WAP Memo 117

SERC Funding and Awards

WAP Memo 121 announces the \$15.2 million to 10 WAP Grantees for PY 2023 SERC projects ranging in scope with a wide range of supported technologies such as solar photovoltaic (PV), solar hot water heaters, cold climate air source heat pumps, heat pump hot water heaters, and tankless water heaters.

- SERC Grantees: CO, MA, ME, MN, MT, NH, NY, OH, OK, VA,

WAP Memo 117 announces the \$70 million available in SERC BIL funds with an **extended deadline to March 29, 2024.**

NASCSP Recommended Action:

Consider working with your Subgrantees on a SERC application or supporting your Subgrantee's SERC applications.

WPN 24-5: Solar Photovoltaic System Warranties

- Program Operations funds can be used to purchase extended warranties on PV systems. (cost included in SIR calculation)
- Does not include Service Agreements
- Default lifespans established in WPN 23-6
 (20 years) shall be used for cost evaluations
 - If all components of the system have warranties/manufacturer estimated lifetime greater than 20 years, then the SIR of the system can be calculated using the lifespan of the shortest warranty period

WPN BIL-5: ACPU and Allowable Use of Funds

 Instructs Grantees how to calculate the ACPU for DOE BIL funds. BIL ACPU will follow a 5-year average of annual ACPU limits from PY 2022-2026.

- Allowable Use of Funds
 - DOE BIL can be funds CAN be braided with DOE WRF, SERC, E&I funds.
 - DOE BIL funds shall NOT be braided with DOE formula and CSPP funds.
 - Both DOE Formula and DOE BIL can be braided with LIHEAP or Other funds.

WPN BIL-6: Applicability of Davis-Bacon Act Prevailing Wage Requirements

- DBA applies to BIL funded Multifamily buildings with 5 or more units.
- Grantees, Subgrantees, contractors, and Subcontractors must include the applicable wage determinations in bid solicitations, grants, etc.
- DOE has procured <u>LCPtracker</u> software for assistance with certified payroll reporting. Contact PO for training and access.
 - DOE will not require retroactive filing in this system, but Grantee/Subgrantee must maintain DBA records.
- Flexibility in using prevailing wage lists to determine
 SIR
 - SIR can be calculated using 'Residential' wages even if 'Building' wages are required to be paid to contractors.

WPN BIL-6: Applicability of Davis-Bacon Act Prevailing Wage Requirements CONT'D

- Wage Determinations
 - 5 Stories or more = <u>Building</u>
 - 4 Stories or less = Residential
 - Determine wage for each task <u>here</u>.
- DBA Compliance Costs
 - Grantee/Subgrantee training: T&TA
 - Grantee oversight: admin or T&TA
 - Subgrantee compliance/contractor oversight: admin or Program operations
- Grantees must submit a Semi-Annual Davis Bacon Act Enforcement Report bi-annually in PAGE (4/21 and 10/21)

WPN 24-3: 2024 Federal Poverty Guidelines and Definition of Income

- Defines Income and exclusions
- Requirements for Proof of Eligibility, re-certification, child support, and annualization of income

For families with more than 8 persons, 100% of poverty level increases \$5,380 for each additional person. Therefore, for weatherization at 200% of poverty level, add \$10,760 for each additional person. Expanded tables provided by HHS showing up to a family of 14 can be found here.

WPN 24-6: Vehicle and Equipment Purchases and Disposition using WAP Funds

- Applies to Formula, BIL, Competitive Grants
- Amortization is allowable
- Prior approval required for vehicle purchases <u>10 CFR</u> <u>440.18(d)(6)</u>
- WPN includes steps for obtaining DOE approval and minimum info req'd
- No approval needed for leasing
- Recordkeeping requirements
- Disposition requirements
 - Vehicle and Equipment Disposal Decision Tree

WAP MEMO 109: HUD, DOE Eligible Building Lists - REVISED

- DOE/HUD Eligible Building List update
 - Public Housing Buildings Qualified
 - Public Housing Further Verification Required
 - Assisted Multifamily Properties
- Updates to the client eligibility expansion FAQ

WAP MEMO 123: Discount Rate for CostEffectiveness Calculations

- WAP regulations (<u>10 CFR 440.21</u>) require that weatherization materials "must be cost-effective..., discounted to present value."
- WPN 23-6 Revised Energy Audit Approval Procedures provided guidance on the necessary calculations for making this determination.
- As of November 9, 2023, <u>OMB Circular A-4</u> set the new discount rate at <u>two percent (2%)</u>, <u>effective March 1</u>, **2024**, updating from the historically used 3% rate.
- Grantees should ensure this rate is updated in their energy audit tools by March 1, 2024.

WAP MEMO 125: WAP Program Year 2024 Continuing Resolution— Allocation Planning

- WAP is operating under a temporary Continuing Resolution (CR) through March 1, 2024.
- Per <u>WPN 24-1</u>, until a final budget is passed, Grantees should develop plans using the same funding level as the PY 2023 Appropriated Funds outlined in <u>WPN 23-2</u>.
- PY 2024 Grantee Plans approved prior to the final FY 2024 budget being signed will be *incrementally funded* to align with the CR.
- <u>Note</u>: DOE received updated data from the factors that affect grantee allocations. Each dataset for these factors will be applied for PY 2024, and <u>all</u> Grantee allocations are expected to be impacted.
