
Compliance & Best Practices

- CSBG Compliance Overview: Providing an overview of CSBG compliance requirements.
- Identifying Needs & Challenges: Discussing the needs and challenges faced by new EDs.





State Association Support

- Plugging New ED's into the Network: New ED Academy (Pairing and Mentoring, introducing new ED's to National Partners, Peer Audits)
- Introducing new Executive Directors to the unique aspects of Community Action through a comprehensive manual of key acronyms and essential resources.
- Creating a Safe Place MCAP State Association Orientationfosters open communication, build trust, and provide the necessary support and guidance they need to navigate their roles effectively.




