





THE KNOWNS AND THE FORTHCOMINGS



- CAR v3.0 received OMB approval (OMB No.: 0970-0492; Expires: December 31, 2027).
- CAR v3.0 will not be mandatory for the FY25 (due March 31, 2026) and FY26 (due March 31, 2027) reports.



Per ACF-OCS-CSBG-DCL-24-06

- OCS will be issuing CAR v3.0 guidance to the Network and TTA will follow.
- CAR v3.0 TTA resources will be created.

TIP: Even without the forthcoming guidance and TTA, the network can begin preparing for the transition from CAR v2. I to CAR v3.0. It does mean, however, that a "flexibility" lens is needed to align with the availability of guidance and TTA resources.

CAR V2. I TO CAR V3.0 TRANSITION TIPS

DEVELOP A CAR V2.1 TO CAR V3.0 DOCUMENT

Develop a document that can help you compare the CAR v2. I datapoints your agency is reporting on to CAR v3.0.

CAR V2.1 TO CAR V3.0 COMPARISON DOCUMENT EXAMPLE - BLANK

LOOK FOR ONE-TO-ONE RELATIONSHIPS

CAR v2. I and CAR v3.0 may look different, but there are a lot of similarities between the reports.

RELATIONSHIPS: FNPI EXAMPLE

TIP: Not all CAR v3.0 datapoints will read the same as their CAR v2.1 counterpart. The key is to look for similarities in what data is being captured.

LOOK FOR MANY-TO-ONE RELATIONSHIPS

CAR v2. I has many options to choose from compared to CAR v3.0. One reason for this is because several CAR v2. I options were combined to create one.

MANY-TO-ONE RELATIONSHIP

DATA COLLECTION OPTION I

The first option is to continue collecting data at the CAR v2.1 level and then combine all applicable datapoints together into a single datapoint for CAR v3.0 reporting.

NOTE: The agency will need to provide an unduplicated count for CAR v3.0 reporting.

LOOK FOR ONE TO MANY RELATIONSHIPS

While uncommon, a single CAR v2.1 datapoint many have been separated into multiple CAR v3.0 datapoints.

The datapoint used for CAR v2.1 reporting will be deactivated and the applicable CAR v3.0 datapoints will be added to the data collection process.

LOOK FOR NEW DATAPOINTS

CAR v3.0 may have new datapoints that the agency wants to report on.

DATAPOINTS: SERVICE EXAMPLE

NOTE: Distribution of diapers may be currently reported in CAR v2. I using a "best fit" method using either SRV 5nn. (hygiene kits) or SRV 7n. (clothing) or it may have not reported.

DATAPOINTS: FNPI EXAMPLE

CAR v2.1 Datapoints

CAR v3.0 Datapoint

FNPI 5j. The number of individuals served who improved food security through *increased* access to healthy food options

NOTE: This may have been reported under a Health Z indicator to capture the "so what" of a food distribution program or only reported this service under the Service module.

NOTE: When reporting for CAR v2.1, some individuals may have been reported under White or Other.

LOOK FOR REMOVED DATAPOINTS

A CAR v2.1 datapoint may have been deleted and there is no CAR v3.0 option.

DATAPOINTS: OPTIONS

There are four options when determining what it will do if a datapoint was remove.

- I. Remove from the data collection process.
- 2. Continue collecting on the datapoint and chose one of three reporting options.
 - a. Find a "best fit" datapoint in CAR v3.0. This option may not be possible for all removed datapoints.
 - b. Use the Other Service or Other FNPI datapoint to continue reporting on it.
 - c. Do not report on it in CAR v3.0.

LOOK FOR OTHER DIFFERENCES

There are other changes in CAR v3.0 that do not fit elsewhere. Highlight these differences as they may impact the data collection process.

CHANGES MAY BE NECESSARY EXAMPLES MAPPING REVISION

Agency is currently collecting data on two CAR v2.1 FNPIs that are not in CAR v3.0. The agency decides to continue collecting on these as is (i.e., separating out "up to living wage" jobs and "living wage or higher" jobs). This is an example of a many-to-one difference where the agency can map these two datapoints to a single CAR v3.0 datapoint on the generated report. No changes are necessary to the data entry screens, only how the system will report on these.

Datapoints the agency is currently collecting data on and plans to leave as is in the database.

FNPI 1b The number of unemployed adults who obtained employment (up to a living wage).

FNPI 1e The number of unemployed adults who obtained employment (with a living wage or higher).

CAR v3.0 datapoint that the above datapoints will be mapped to when a report is generated to provide an unduplicated count of adults who obtained employment.

FNPI 1d. The number of adults who obtained employment

CHANGES MAY BE NECESSARY EXAMPLES DEACTIVATE DATAPOINT

Agency is currently collecting data on a CAR v2.1 FNPI that is not CAR v3.0. The agency decides that it will no longer continue collecting data on the number of individuals who obtained and maintained employment for at least 90 days. The agency will deactivate this FNPI as an option in the data entry screen.

Datapoint the agency is currently collecting data on and has decided to remove.

FNPI 1c The number of unemployed adults who obtained and maintained employment for at least 90 days (up to a living wage).

TIP: Some data systems may allow the agency to delete datapoints. If the agency wants to go this route, it is suggested that the agency talk with the software vendor to determine how deletion will impact records in which the datapoint was previously selected.

CHANGES MAY BE NECESSARY EXAMPLES ADDED DATAPOINT

Agency is not currently collecting data on a CAR v3.0 FNPI datapoint and the agency plans to start. The agency will add it as an option in the data entry screen.

Datapoint the agency is currently not collecting data on and is planning to add it as an option in the data entry screen.

FNPI 4g. The number of households who avoided utility shut-off, had utility service restored, or had reduced utility costs

TIP: The added option will probably require mapping so that the system knows where to report on it.

THE OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER

Identification of changes is an important first step, but other steps are needed for a smooth CAR v2. I to CAR v3.0 transition.

WHAT TO CONSIDER

- Create an Implementation Plan
 - What needs to happen?
 - By when does it need to happen?
 - Who is responsible for it happening?
- Data Collection Changes
 - Are changes needed to forms?
 - Are changes needed to data systems?
- Communication and Training






